Sunday. No! In France, the bells brought us chocolate eggs, chocolate chickens, chocolate fish, etc. Why bells, would you ask? Well, the tradition around the bells originates from the 7th century when the Church forbade the ringing of the bells in homage to the death of



Christ between Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday. In France, legend has it that on Maundy Thursday, the bell's chimes flee to Rome, where the Pope blesses them. There, they collect the Easter eggs, which will be scattered in gardens and yards on their return journey. I can't remember ever going



outside to gather those. My favorite was the "Fritures de Pâques", small fish-shaped chocolates. The fish is the symbol of Christianity, and during the Roman era, it was a signal for persecuted Christians to distinguish friends from foes. The little Easter fish are called "fritures" (fried whitebait) because of their shape and are often packed into straw baskets or chocolate boxes to resemble a school of delicious little fish.

What about the Easter Bunny? Sorry to disappoint but no such thing! In France, we eat the bunnies, sorry but delicious!

In any case, the sugar high was intense! Ah those were glorious days. SWEET DAYS! Another part of our Easter tradition was to have a great Easter meal, usually a leg of lamb and spring veggies! Along with friends and family. Easter...SWEET! As a child I can't say that I fully understood what the day was all about. I knew it was a special day. I knew it was a great day. I knew it was a sweet day.

Many years and Easter celebrations have since come and gone and I am not sure that I have any better a grasp on Easter. It is still a sweet day. It is a great day. It is still the day that heaven and earth resound in the great thanksgiving of the victory of our Savior over sin and death and evil. But I have to confess that I still cannot comprehend the depths and heights and breadth and width of the Savior's work to defeat death and open heaven for me and this world. This I know only by faith. The faith I have built piece and piece, by the grace of God. Easter...it's still S-W-E-E-T! It is still filled with awe and amazement! The grave is still empty and death is still dead! Easter is the Holy Christian Church's greatest thanksgiving celebration. Mark's Gospel account of that first Easter is always such an Easter reality check for me. The first words that greeted the morning sunrise on the faces of the followers who made their way to the tomb were,

"He is not here." The disciples received those words with fear and amazement. They heard the words as bad news. In Mark's Gospel there is no appearance of Jesus recorded. Just grave clothes, an empty tomb and the word of the angel. For fear and amazement Jesus' followers could not as yet grab hold of the words that were next proclaimed, "He is risen." In Mark's Gospel Jesus remained hidden. Jesus is nowhere to be found. It amazes me still today that the greatest event in human history, the greatest reason for thanksgiving remained hidden that first Easter. That is how the oldest account of Mark's Gospel ends. An empty tomb... A hidden Easter thanksgiving! Of course you know the rest of the story –it's HiStory and it's your story! The tomb is empty because Jesus is risen and death...your death is dead! Easter is coming ... S-W-E-E-T!



Let's say that being a single Mom means I need more money to pay the bills! I am very fortunate to work at Open Sky Community Services as a Peer Counselor. Open Sky offers a wide variety of services for individuals experiencing different conditions and issues such as autism & intellectual/developmental disabilities, behavioral and mental

health problems, housing and homelessness issues, and addictions. A peer counselor is someone in recovery, usually from addiction or mental illness, who is trained to support and counsel others in similar situations, using their own experiences and training to provide encouragement and resources. I am incredibly grateful as I see this work as an extension of my ministry to people in need.



Messianic Passover Seder

During Holy Week, on Thursday, April 17, also known as Maundy Thursday, we will host a traditional Passover Seder at 6:30pm.

The Last Supper with Yeshua/Jesus and his disciples was a Passover Seder. It was also the initial institution of what we now consider Holy Communion in churches today around the world. Concerning the Passover, our Master, and Messiah Yeshua-Jesus said, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer." (Luke 22:15). Jesus lived and died as an observant Jew who sought to fulfill God's promises to the Jewish people, bring salvation to Israel, and the Nations. By celebrating Passover, we honor, remember and re-enact what He did with His disciples.

We also connect to the Jewish roots of faith, and the people of Israel. This celebration allows us to gain a much deeper understanding of the person and work of the Messiah.

The festival involves a symbolic meal with specific foods and traditions to remember the Israelites' exodus from Egypt.

The Passover meal is known as a seder, which means "order." The Seder has a set "'order" comprised of 15 steps. A book called the Haggadah takes the guests through each and every step.

The Passover seder is probably the most celebrated and beloved of Jewish home rituals. Many Jews have

cherished memories of past family times spent at a seder. Pastor Sabina will share memories of seders she spent with her grandparents and will bring traditional




items to share with all guests.

We will also share a full traditional meal of lamb (turkey for the "lambophobes), and Sabina's grand-mother's matzo ball soup!

We will then remember that last evening with Jesus, with foot/hand washing and Communion.
